This club started last January and within 4 months had made significant contributions to identifying challenges and strengths within the high school. They have a clear action plan of goals they want to accomplish. The students truly drive the program with several staff coaches but it is their club.

This club came about after the 2nd death of a high school student by suicide. A friend of this student is the one who said we aren't doing enough and got the club up and running. This is a student who had been involved in earlier SHP programming as a 9th grader (pre-Covid) and again during Covid when he participated in presenting the Trusted Adult training for staff.

Many of these students acknowledge the reality of dealing with stress, anxiety, and depression and are working to break the stigma which is strong in our community. This group is personal for them and they are committed to making our school a more connected, safer, and fun place. They have talked about the legacy they hope to leave behind so others see speaking up and getting help is the norm and not the exception.
